# DEAR BISHOPS HOCKEY PLAYERS AND STAFF

What an experience awaits all of you players, staff and any supporting parents coming along. You are coming to what I call the modern age home of hockey! I have been living in The Netherlands for the past fourteen years and have played in both Belgium and Germany numerous times. I can honestly say you couldn't have chosen a better place to tour.

Hockey is huge in Europe, clubs have thousands of members and often five to seven astro's so it's very different to South Africa. In The Netherlands there are around forty to fifty international players currently playing the Hoofdklasse (premier league) so if you have the chance to watch a match don't arrive thinking you're watching another club game, take note and you'll really learn a great deal.

If I can offer some advice to those of you who haven't played many foreign teams before. You are going to be exposed to new skills and tactics from your opponents which perhaps you aren't used to. Try to concentrate on your own teams processes and the improvements you are trying to make as a squad ahead of the season to come. You may need to adapt to a few things but the bulk of your concentration should be focused to your own decision making and that of the team. This opportunity will allow you to learn and improve if you are willing to give it time, so make the most of it when you are together on the field.

You will undoubtedly be doing a great deal of sightseeing which is also an important aspect to touring but don't forget when you cross the 'white line' of the field you need

to switch to hockey mode. This is going to be tough so prepare yourself mentally before you arrive at the pitch for every game and training session.

I hope you all have a wonderful time especially in Holland, my current home. Fly the South African flag proudly and enjoy every moment.





# SPENDING SOME TIME WITH OUR THREE RECENT OLYMPIANS

A school - together with family values - goes a long way in developing the characteristics and traits of young people. It is the intention of Bishops to raise Good Men. Good Men are men of value, of kindness, of compassion and understanding of difference. I had the great honour of interviewing our three recent hockey Olympians for this tour brochure: Ryan Julius, Dayaan Cassiem and Mustapha Cassiem, and I came out of that interview thinking that these three individuals were not just exceptional hockey players, but fine young men as well. Humble, genuine, sincere and just decent individuals. The perfect example of the Good Men that Bishops seeks to develop. I do hope you'll enjoy the brief journey through their experiences, and outlook on life and hockey in general.

We broke the interview down into three parts: Their time at Bishops; Professional hockey and words of advice for the tour party; and a Rapid-Fire Question and Answer with questions posed from the touring party themselves.

# Your time at Bishops, and how that impacted your hockey development

How did you end up at Bishops? The common thread here is Warren Wallace. All three players were members of Central Hockey Club in Cape Town, and Mr Wallace identified all three of them at Central. Ryan was the first to come across. He came across to Bishops from CBC St John's in Parklands in 2012.





One of the biggest adjustments was moving from a co-ed school to a single sex school especially so late in your school career. Ryan matriculated in 2013 from Kidd House, and was the Vice-Captain of the 1st Team in 2013. Dayaan and Mustapha were both in White House, with Dayaan captaining the first team in 2017, and Mustapha matriculating in 2020. Unfortunately, 2020 was in the midst of COVID, with no sports being played. The entire school was much the poorer for not being able to watch Mustapha play in his final year.

Bishops hockey was fundamental in providing structure and development to their game. Mustapha especially appreciated the fact that you can play multiple sports, where he also excelled at rugby and cricket, and that there are no numbers on the back of the first team shirt, implying that the Bishops hockey way is not about the individual, but about the whole team. They've taken this mentality all the way up to the national team, where the team is more important than the individual.

Ryan was also a first team cricketer, whilst Dayaan participated in athletics.

# What advice do they have for the boys about preparing for big games?

It is likely that some of the big derby matches will draw larger crowds than the boys have ever played in front of before. Mustapha advises the most important aspect is to try and forget about everything that is going on outside the Astro. If you do this, you will lose structure and forget your role, and what you are meant to be doing. Ryan agreed that this will be the biggest game that the players are liking to play. It tends to get over-hyped, and you need to remember that it is just another game. A big game, yes, but still just another game. Dayaan concurred - you can over-hype yourself before these games. It is just another hockey game. You need to stick to your structures and stay disciplined. To win these games takes hard work, discipline and ensuring you stick to the structure. It would be useful to get a psychologist to help them prepare in that week, as they get incredibly hyped in the build-up to the game. Preparation is important, and in 2022 they prepared for the second Bish-Bosch match by pumping loud music on the Astro, so the boys prepared without being able to verbally communicate with each other.

Ryan - who coached the Bishops 1st team for a number of years - also says it is not a good approach to be overly realistic and try and calm the team down. You need to

be relatable to the boys. You can hype the boys up in the changing room, because that is what they want, but you also need to get them to understand that the nerves can also disable them. One of his themes is: "Wherever you are, be all there. Be present in every moment." He suggests when you get on the Astro, take it all in, feel your boots on the Astro, because if you take it all in, you are already present in the game, and can block out the external distractions.





# Is playing national or provincial A hockey the be all and end all of your hockey careers?

If you are an enthusiastic, talented schoolboy hockey player, but don't make SA U18A or Western Province U18A hockey, is that the end of your dreams? Mustapha says that yes, a fair number of international players came through the system, but a number didn't. Some peak late, some peak too early, so the trick is to keep playing. University hockey is still important, and players get recognised at university hockey tournaments. Ryan also agrees that players also emerge through the university structures, so players must keep playing.

The number of caps one has for the outdoor national side is also a source of great pride for our three Olympians. At the time of writing, Dayaan had 74 caps, Ryan 69 and Mustapha 48. Mustapha noted that, with the limited amount of international hockey they play, to have played 40 tests is immense. Ryan has been playing for 5 years, has only missed two or three tournaments, and has only played 69 tests.

# Professional hockey and words of advice for the boys travelling overseas for hockey

The tour is 13 days long. Domestic tours are much shorter, so this will be an extended period when the tour group is together. What advice would one give about gelling as a team and spending so much time together? Dayaan captained the 2017 tour side, and Mustapha was

also on that tour, as a Grade 9. Dayaan said the culture that has been built at Bishops hockey is that it doesn't matter what grade you are in when you come into the Bishops first team, it is one team. It is likely that the 1st team for the 2023 season will be drawn largely from this tour squad, so how you interact with your fellow tourists will carry forward into the domestic season as well. Work together, stick to the culture and continue to develop as a team. You'll play lots of hockey, but you'll also have lots of fun – so enjoy yourself.

What would make a successful tour? Mustapha believes you need to expect that your opponents will be at a higher level than you, with some U18s who may already be playing Hoofdeklasse hockey. Go with a mindset of learning - as you will play against players who are bigger than you, smarter than you and better than you. What happens on the tour doesn't define your season, but it gives you a fantastic opportunity to learn and experience different hockey styles. Dayaan remembers that, although they lost some games on tour, they came back and won their first league game back in Cape Town 9-0. They felt like different hockey players, because they learnt so much overseas. The ideas of the coaches in Europe are different to South Africa, so absorb as much as you can. Appreciate the European approach to hockey, as often it is the main sport in a particular region.

The tour goes to Mönchengladbach, to Gladbacher HTC, the club where both Dayaan and Mustapha play in Germany.

What can the boys expect from the Club, and from European clubs in general? According to Dayaan - who has been at the club for 4 years - Gladbacher HTC is a very 'brotherhood' club, and have been fantastic to both Dayaan and Mustapha, ensuring everyone is comfortable. The German clubs are more hard work clubs, whereas the Netherlands tend to be more flair clubs. The boys are going to learn to defend well on tour, as especially in Germany it is more about the one-on-one skills, defending properly, tackling properly. It's going to be the beginning of Spring, says Mustapha, so it is a great time of the year to go. They'll really enjoy the club facilities, with a pool, indoor court and restaurant.

There can be no doubt about the loyalty of these three Olympians not just to Bishops, but to their European clubs as well. What drives that loyalty, and when does it get to the stage that you need to make a decision in the best interests of your career? Gladbacher has been exceedingly good to them, says Mustapha, treating them almost like royalty, but there may well come a time when decisions need to be made to better their career. For Dayaan, it all comes down to giving back to people who have made the path easier for them, which he experienced when he got to Bishops. Family values are also very important, and these values include loyalty, being humble and giving back to the school. It is important to Dayaan that they open the door for the next person who comes in, just like the doors were opened for them. Mustapha also believes you should never forget where you came from, a motto driven into him by his father. Bishops gave them an opportunity that probably changed their lives, and to them it is second nature to come back and assist whenever they can, without having to be asked.

Is there a telepathy between the Cassiem brothers when they play together? I remember vividly a perfect 50m slap on the diagonal from Mustapha, then in Grade 9, on to Dayaan's stick at the top of the opponents D, then a matric in 2017, that appeared telepathic. Ryan was actually the coach of the 1sts that year, and it was a tactic they worked on, but you still need to execute. The development of a relationship on the hockey Astro isn't limited to the Astro. You need to develop that relationship off the field as well, and it will translate on to the hockey pitch.

### Some rapid fire questions from the tour party

**Indoor vs outdoor?** Dayaan loves outdoor more, as he enjoys running fast, aerial skills and the fact that he is a dedicated striker in outdoor. Ryan's main sport is outdoor, but he enjoys indoor more. Mustapha is clearindoor is his favourite. You can never be comfortable in indoor. There is always a scoring opportunity. You can be 4-0 up and still not feel comfortable.

Who's the fastest amongst the three of you? They've actually had this race. Dayaan is the fastest on the Astro, but Ryan is the quickest in a sprint - although he is challenged by Tevin Kok in the national side.



**Do you miss your schoolboy hockey?** All three miss their schoolboy hockey greatly, especially Friday Night Lights. It's an opportunity to enjoy your hockey, without the pressure of the nation watching you.

What makes a good captain, Dayaan? It's about leading well on and off the field. Captaincy isn't just on the field. It's about making sure that everyone is on the same page, sticking to the culture, and putting the team before you. Don't worry about yourself as the captain, make sure the team is doing the right thing.

What's the most important trophy for you, Dayaan? It's actually a school trophy - we had the Knockout Trophy, and that year we beat Rondebosch 3 times in a row - the 2 league matches and the Knockout. That trophy is pretty special to me.

When did you decide you wanted to play professional hockey, Mustapha? It was during school, and when Dayaan went over to Europe, that motivated me to play professional hockey.

What is the elimination skill you use the most, Mustapha? Probably the outside pull and extend.

How does the hockey life in the Netherlands differ from South Africa, Ryan? It's very different, very professional. The league is extremely competitive. The top 6 teams you play are equal to about an entry international game.

What part of your game requires the most skills, and practice, Ryan? My defence. My defence can always use more work, especially as the rules of the game change.

**The Olympics or the World Cup?** All three - without a pause - choose the Olympics. They were staying in the Olympic Village, and it was insane, they said. Ryan turned the corner and bumped straight into Novak Djokovic. Mustapha recalls sitting in the dining hall and seeing Dani Alves and Richarlison sitting close by.

**How do you improve your overhead distance?** Mustapha says three simple things: strength work in the gym, working on your technique, and practicing it as much as possible.


How has hockey helped improve you as a person? Mustapha says it has taught him a lot of life lessons, living with losing and winning. Overcoming tough moments and learning to manage the highs and lows of playing sport, especially at a professional level. It is difficult to manage when the highs of a successful tournament start to fade, but you learn how to manage these fluctuations.

Ryan says hockey has taught him a lot about organisation and planning. It's in your calendar the whole year, and then you still need to prioritise academics, and ensure that you have everything lined up. This is especially so when you leave school - where everyone knows you - and you go to university where you are just a number in a big pond. Hockey helped him be organised, to prioritise and to plan effectively.

For Dayaan, hockey has helped him be mentally strong, and that you are first a human before a hockey player. We make mistakes, because we are human, but because we are a hockey player, we think we can be perfect. Hockey has taught him to be a good human, and make sure he opens the path for others.

And when it is all done? Coaching? Mustapha would like to go into the psychology or analysis side of the game, and be part of a team, whilst Ryan is heading into the working world, and when his hockey playing days are done, that is likely to be it, certainly from a hockey profession. For Dayaan, hockey is his life, and he would love to head in to the coaching side, be it as a director of hockey at a school, or something similar, or open a foundation to open the pathway for those less fortunate.

And so my time with these three remarkable young men came to an end. It was an absolute pleasure and privilege to be in the company of such Good Men. Bishops hockey, and our boys heading off on tour, are more fortunate than they realise to have the expertise of these three men at their disposal. We wish Ryan, Dayaan and Mustapha all the very best, and continued success in all they do.


